### Web Description

American Impressionist painters often gathered in art colonies across the country, such as the New Hope colony centered in Bucks County, Pennsylvania. Edward Willis Redfield, co-founder of the colony, used it as a winter base, producing many snowy views of the Delaware River Valley. Under the flat blue sky of *Winter Reflections*, the frozen waterway is made up of multicolored loose brushstrokes. The brilliant sunlight glinting off the snow is a true challenge for artists like Redfield, who tried to capture the momentary effect of light.
